
# Q3 How important is it to you that the Mayor is elected directly by the residents rather than by the Council?









#	RESPONSES
1	Everyone has the opportunity to vote for strong leaders to be put in the position of councillors. Since those put in as councillors are voted in by the majority of the population it would allow for that majority of that population to trust them to make a good selection for a leader/mayor for that council. a good leader should emerge from the round table of councillors each with a vision for our towns future. I also feel it is very important that there be a public forum (at least one) where residents of this town can hear the vision of each person running for council and have an opportunity to question each as well. We definitely missed this on the last election even though in spite of the "covid thing" it could have been live streamed from any one of a number of venues in town.
2	Perhaps a non-binding expression of preference with election of council i.e. Mark ballot of Councillors but have a space for "preferential" numbering of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. for Mayor. In the end, the Council "appoints" the one with the most #1 preference, and that person acts as a chair person for the meetings, and represents the town.
3	Preferential vote maybe if several were running for Mayor.
4	Don't fix what works!
5	If it is not broken, don't fix it.
6	We don't want to get stuck with a situation like Trochu where the same Mayor has held the position for 21 years. That is not healthy for the community.

8	All who have given me verbal feedback have mentioned how this survey is one sided and does not capture the main reason for the potential change in bylaw.
9	Electing your Mayor and Councillors is a democratic privilege. Taking away electing a Mayor by the people is taking away more rights from the taxpaying public living in the community.  Anyone who runs for Mayor and loses, knows before running that that is a risk, and should have run for council to minimize the risk, and at least be on council.
10	The people of the town should elect the mayor. Not the council
