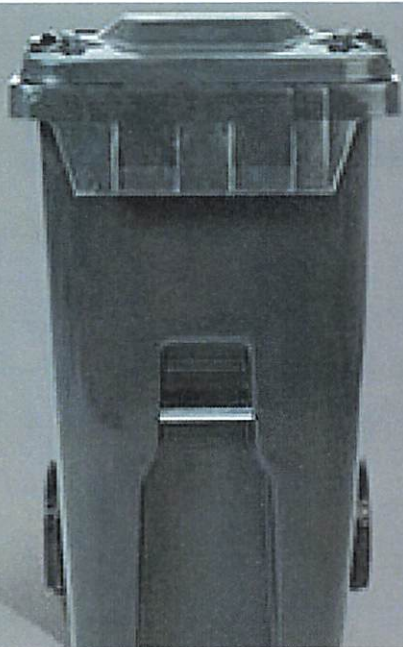

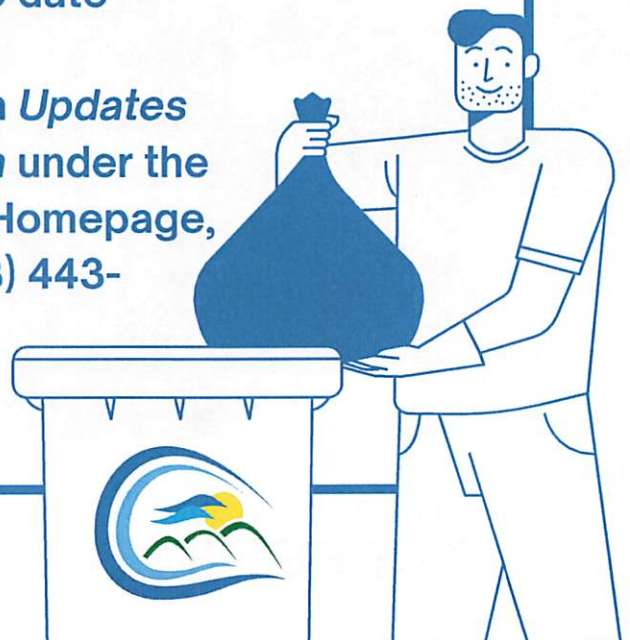
Introducing Automated Garbage & Recycling Collection to the Town of Three Hills

This Collection Guide will provide all the information you need to get started with using your Garbage and Recycling Carts.

In late November 2021, the Town will be implementing Automated Waste Collection. In preparation of this change, each house in town will be delivered (1) 360L Blue Recycling Cart, as well as (1) 240L Black Garbage Cart.

Once a household has received their Garabge and Recycling Carts, they should begin using each cart for appropriate garbage and recycling collection. Collection Schedules and appropriate materials for each Cart can be found further in this information package.

Hard Plastics



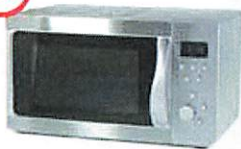
Aluminum & Tin Cans

Black Garbage Cart

- Intended for any materials that are not allowed to be placed in the Blue Recycling Carts.
- See below for examples of acceptable and unacceptable items for the Black Garbage Carts

Cart Placement Guide

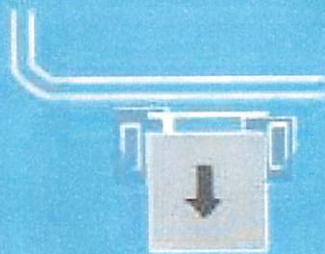
Park It

Cart should be on the street with the wheels against the curb.



Point It

Arrows should point to the centre of the road.

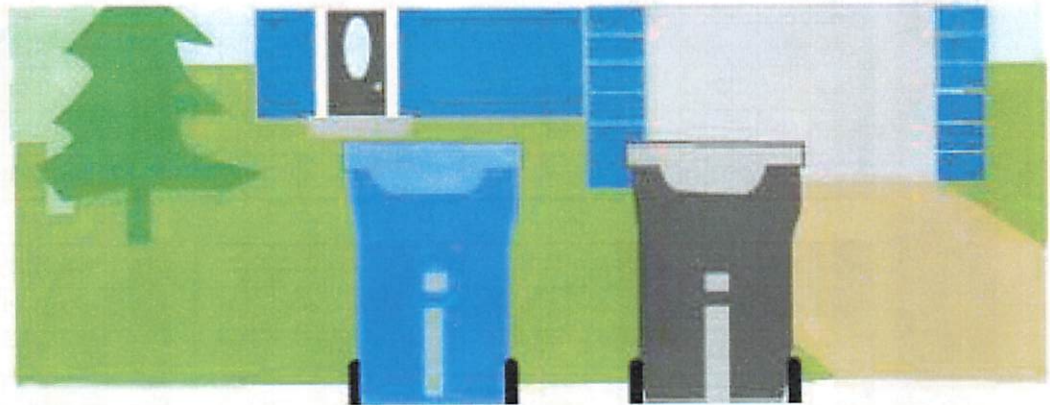

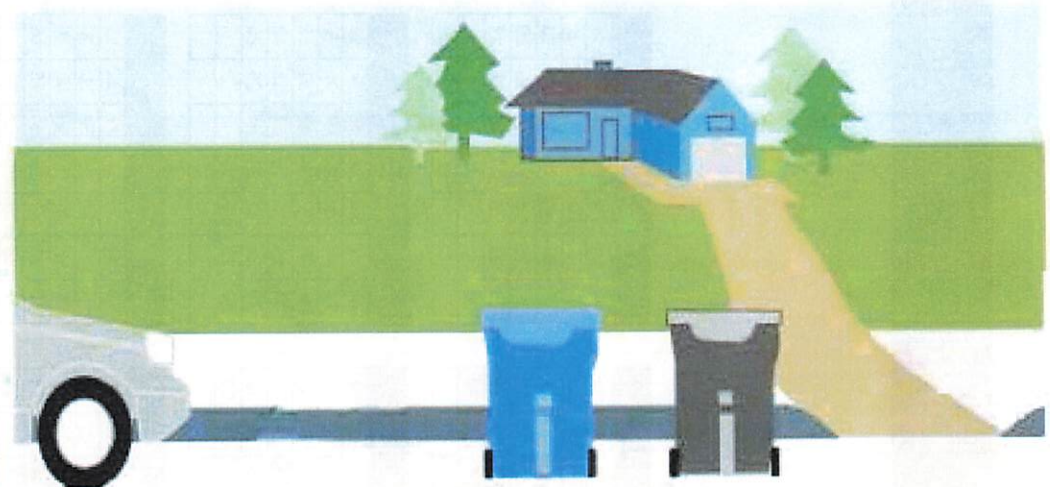

Space It

Give at least an arm's length of clearance on all sides.



If you have Front Street Pickup
1 m clearance all around



If you have Back Alley Pickup
1 m clearance all around
